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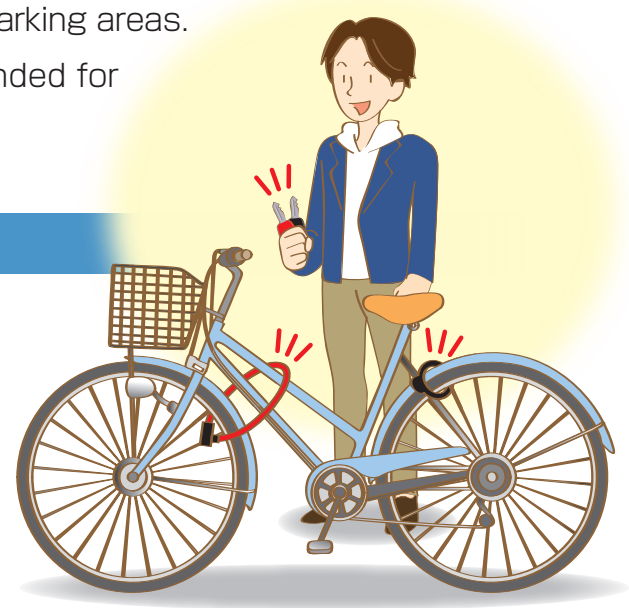
Please lock your bicycle with two locks!

We have received reports from students about thefts of bicycles that were left unlocked in the bicycle parking areas. Even if you will only leave your bicycle unattended for a short time, please lock it to prevent theft.

To prevent theft:

● Lock your bicycle with two locks.

Don't forget to lock your bicycle when parking it, preferably with two or more locks. Try to make your bicycle impossible, or at least difficult, to steal. It is more effective to use multiple locks of different types.



● Use designated parking areas.

When parking on campus, please park your bicycle in one of the parking areas, inside the white lines. Bicycles parked outside the white lines may be moved to prevent them from blocking foot traffic.

In general, try to use parking facilities monitored by security cameras or staff.



● Register your bicycle

By registering your bicycle, you can ensure that if it's stolen, it will be returned quickly once found.

If you haven't registered your bicycle yet, you can do so at the place where you bought it or any convenient bicycle shop.

Beware of prepaid card fraud!

There have been incidents of fraud in which the victim is asked to purchase a prepaid card then relay the code printed on it.



Example:

A student received an email from someone, under the name of their academic advisor, urgently requesting that they buy a prepaid card. Believing it was a request from an instructor, the student bought a card in the specified amount and sent a photo of the code. They realized it was fraud when they received further email asking them to buy more cards.

Prepaid cards can be purchased easily at convenience stores, and anybody with the card's code can use it, even if they don't have the physical card. Giving the code to another person is the same as handing them the full cash amount of the card. It is very difficult to get your money back in this case, so please be careful of such scams.



Advice

● Don't respond to emails too readily

If you receive an email or request that seems strange to you, don't answer. Consult with your family, friends, or the university about suspicious email messages.



● Do not provide prepaid card codes to others.

Do not buy prepaid cards or provide card codes at the request of other people. It could implicate you in fraud or financial trouble.



If you do get into such trouble, contact the **prepaid card's issuing company**, or the **nearest Consumer Affairs Center**.

About the Tohoku Innovation Human Resources Development Program (DATEntre)

According to the Japan Student Services Organization, only about 30% of international students who want to build a career in Japan are able to do so. Even Japan-based foreign investment companies often demand JLPT certification of N2 or above as their clients are Japanese enterprises. Those wishing to enter major corporations must spend large amounts of time learning how to prepare for enterprise research, self-evaluations, entry sheets, etc. Simultaneously performing studies/research and job-hunting activities in Japanese is not easy for international students. It is critical that they be well-prepared.

The Tohoku Innovation Human Resources Development Program (DATEntre) is a support program that helps international students systematically prepare for employment in Japan. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, individual counseling, entry sheet checking, industry research seminars, and exchange events with alumni working in Japan will be held online during the 2020 academic year.

The curriculum mainly comprises classes from the Tohoku University Japanese Language Program at Kawauchi and General Education curricula. It helps students to acquire the Japanese communication skills and understanding of corporate culture required to work in Japan. In consultation with the instructors, students can determine a course schedule that does not conflict with their research and meets their needs. In addition, the extracurricular seminars enable students to prepare for job-hunting activities in an organized manner. Please join DATEntre and turn your dreams of working in Japan into a reality!
